Directed by Marco Berger | Argentina, Spain | Spanish, English Subtitles | 116 mins | Unclassified 15+

Festival favourite Marco Berger (The Blonde One, MGFF19) teases with another story about male desire that sizzles just below the surface. One hot summer, openly gay Pedro returns to Buenos Aires to spend a holiday with his cousin and some friends - including Maxi, who's seemingly straight and full of swagger. The pair enjoys some friendly, machismofuelled flirting that even they're not sure how to contain, but are they playing with fire? With a palpable chemistry between his two leads, Berger keeps them (and us) on the very edge. Opening Night Party tickets are available.

Directed by Veit Helmer | Germany, Georgia | No Dialogue | 82 mins | Unclassified 15+

Public service announcement: this super-charming film will leave you grinning from ear to ear. Cleverly told without a word of dialogue, *Gondola* sparks queer joy as it follows the burgeoning romance between two young female cable-car conductors whose carriages pass each other all day long. As their chemistry blooms, they find ingenious ways to communicate their feelings. This funny and totally original love story is well worth the ride!

Directed by Dominic Savage | Canada | English | 100 mins | Unclassified 15+

After years in Toronto, Sam (Elliot Page) takes a long-dreaded trip to visit family for the first time since his transition. En route, he runs into Katherine, a high school crush, and feelings from their unresolved past begin to bubble to the surface. Capturing an all-too-familiar experience of trying to remain patient in the face of clumsy (if well-intentioned) acceptance, Close to You is an emotionally observant drama about coming home as yourself, only to be treated like a completely different person. Directed by Ray Yeung | Hong Kong, China | Cantonese, English Subtitles | 95 mins | Unclassified 15+

Hong Kong couple Pat and Angie have been devoted to each other for over 30 years, with the full support of Pat's extended family. However, when Pat dies without leaving a will, a devastated Angie is confronted with the true limits of acceptance as money and the law become involved. Filmmaker Ray Yeung (Twilight's Kiss, MGFF21; see it On Demand) delivers a powerfully restrained examination of grief in the face of inequality in this Berlinale Teddy award winner.

Directed by Marcelo Caetano | Brazil, France, The Netherlands | Portuguese, English Subtitles | 106 mins | Unclassified 18+

Fresh from a stint in juvie, 18 year old Wellington must fend for himself on the streets of São Paolo. When he encounters older, handsome sex worker Ronaldo there's an instant animalistic attraction. Taken under his wing as a protégé, the pair are caught in a constant push and pull between fiery romance and the realities of business. Filled with moments of surprising tenderness, *Baby* is a colourful, empathetic ode to queer found family. Content warning, see website.

Directed by Emily Railsback | USA | English | 68 mins | Unclassified 15+

This warm indie drama tenderly follows the everyday life of a lesbian couple trying to raise their toddler while navigating financial and career uncertainties during the pandemic. When Bette and Elsie find themselves jobless and potentially homeless, they turn to Elsie's wealthy, religious aunt for help. Talented and driven competitive cheerleader Riley (Devery Jacobs, *Reservation Dogs*) dreams of joining the Thunderhawks, an elite professional cheer squad. When she and her girlfriend are given the opportunity to join, new pressures from a demanding head coach (Evan Rachel Wood, *Westworld*) and Riley's own pursuit of perfection cause her world to spiral. When 14-year-old Jamie learns that his cousin's new boyfriend is joining their camping trip, he's less than thrilled. But over the course of the weekend, he develops much more complicated feelings towards the surprisingly handsome and charming Dan. Fragments of a Life Loved is an evocative documentary that tenderly revisits the past loves of Chloé Barreau. Having meticulously and reverently documented her relationships since her teens, Barreau juxtaposes memories with present-day reflections through archival footage and current interviews. This brave and poignant film explores the intimate nuances of love and memory, offering a unique perspective on human connection and the art of storytelling.

US-based Egyptian boyfriends Mo and Hisham are forced back into the closet when they travel to Alexandria to visit family. Having not returned in years, Mo is haunted by traumatic memories from his childhood. The pressure to hide who he is resurfaces old anxieties that he has been cursed as punishment for his 'sins' in this tense, contemplative supernatural horror. Content warning, see website.

Proud pansexual Nate hasn't spoken to his brother Ged in over four years following an intense falling out. But when their mother passes away, the brothers must set aside their differences to fulfil her dying wish: to scatter her ashes at the old family home in remote Narrabri. Setting out across Australia in a black hearse (courtesy of Nate's funeral director boyfriend), they're forced to finally confront the ghosts of their past in this touching comedy-drama. A poignant comedy-drama about older gay couple Thom and Henri, who suddenly find themselves living in close quarters after Henri retires. When Henri begins to withdraw from the relationship it pushes the increasingly baffled Thom to go all-out to rekindle their love – no matter the price. When a roll of old film is uncovered, matriarch Rose's memories drift back to life in the early 1960s, centering on a forbidden lesbian romance with her playful and enigmatic friend Louise.

Video store clerk Hailey researches how to be a lesbian by watching every sapphic film she can get her hands on. But when she develops a crush on a customer, Hailey embarks on a series of hapless misadventures in her attempts to come out – and maybe even find love. An audience and critics' favourite at the 2021 Mardi Gras Film Festival, Twilight's Kiss (Suk Suk) comes from prolific queer film director Ray Yeung (All Shall Be Well, QSFF24; Front Cover, MGFF16). As a relationship blooms between two older men, they must also navigate societal responsibilities while guiding each other through wandering daydreams of roads untraveled and the reality of life in Hong Kong.

From the exciting butterflies of a new high school crush, to the toxic expectations of a sweaty gym hook-up, to the overwhelming grief after the death of a husband, these films navigate an array of topics with sincerity and humour.

A trans man's search for his lost bird with the help of a trans woman (and a cavalcade of backup dancers).
