

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
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

7pm, Academy Twin THE AGGRESSIVES

< USA, 2004, 75 mins, video Directed by Daniel Peddle >

Five years in the making, THE AGGRESSIVES features intimate interviews with lesbians, transgenders, pretty tomboys, dyke-queens, femme studs, stud butches and all round gender benders who define themselves as "aggressives". These aggressives embrace their gender queer identities unapologetically. They all participate in the underground lesbian "ball" scene in New York, competing for prizes and the glory of "passing" in an endless array of queer identity categories.



7.30pm, Academy Twin THE GRAFFITI ARTIST

< USA, 2004, 80 mins, video Directed by James Bolton > Persons 15 years and over admitted to this session.

In this moody tale of complicated young love, we meet Nick, a teenage loner who doesn't say much. From bus shelter to railway yard, Nick spends his hours spray-painting his tag - RUPTURE - anywhere he can get away with it. Nick's brooding blue eyes soon begin taking in fellow young graffiti artist, Jesse. Between Seattle and Portland, the two start a series of gorgeous artistic collaborations.

What do you do when true love comes along and you're already in "The Relationship"? Two women, Robin and Lacie, unexpectedly fall for each other when they are cast as lesbian lovers in a two-woman play. Robin, however, is essentially married to her girlfriend of six years, and Lacie has barely had a relationship that lasted past sunrise. This true-life story of two stand-up comics and actors starring as themselves is a riotous reflection on the early days of their relationship, and the complicated neuroses that accompany all major love life decisions.

When Todd (played by director Todd Verow) tires of his steady relationship and dull office job, he looks for a way to return to the sexually exciting life that he lived before. Todd seeks out wanton, anonymous sex on-line, with fuck-buddies, and inside public restrooms. Though this gives him a temporary fix, Todd's boyfriend catches him in the act and throws him out. Forced to live in his office, Todd's compulsion for anonymous sex continues to grow.

an adult. What do you do if three of your four children turn out to be homosexuals? Meet Molly and Ken Smith, founders of PFLAG Western Sydney, and enter

the extraordinary lives of a group of "ordinary" people whose love for their gay, lesbian or transgender children introduced them to new friendships, and emotional Mardi Gras parades, saving a few lives along the way. A documentary that everyone will want to share with their parents.



7pm, Academy Twin **CLARA'S SUMMER**

Clara is a beautiful and inexperienced teenager on holidays at an oceanside summer camp in France when she meets the glamorous and defiant Sonia, who has the reputation for being the camp lesbian. They begin to make their own world within the camp surrounds, as drink, drugs and relationship dramas quickly take holiday priority. A sensuous and naturalistic coming of age story about the messy curiosity of adolescent life.

European filmmakers make very different films than their North American counterparts as evidenced by this excellent program containing several award winners. A naked man finds passion aroused while looking out his window in PAUSE. Party boy Eric is not looking forward to spending holidays at his grandfather's farm in FAR WEST. A passionate straight guy leaves his girlfriend at the bar in W. THOSE CLOUDS explores the feelings of the loss of a loved one in an imaginative style. A boyfriend ends a relationship on a ferry in STYX. In EDDIE & BURT a gay man tries to get the straight boy to dance with him. LOVE NEVER DIES lives up to its title.

Forced together, an intense attraction between Chloe and Jesse ignites a fiery affair, pitting stability, commitment and intimacy in their respective long-term relationships against the exhilaration and hypnotic passion of new love (or is it lust?).

Walloch is a talented comedian, disabled by cerebral palsy. The film includes celebrity guest appearances from Stephen Baldwin, Jerry Stiller, Anne Meara and Michael Musto.

Several encounters are arranged between these two and eventually Lee is inducted into a private group of older homosexual businessmen and their young lovers.

He meets up with a sexy and cool hustler named Butch, and is strongly attracted to him. These two guys are living in totally different worlds and both are on a steep learning curve as a kind of romance develops between them.

This very funny comedy of errors was a big hit at the 12th Raindance Film Festival in Liverpool late in 2004. It is a happy time for the Chopra Family of Preston. Not only is their son Jimi set to become a doctor, but he is about to have an arranged marriage to the beautiful Simran. She is perfect in every way except one - she is not Jack, Jimi's boyfriend and true love. Jimi is torn between loyalty and respect for his family and his love for Jack. CHICKEN TIKKA MASALA is a heart-warming and funny story about sexuality and family that will definitely strike a chord.

A politically-minded coming of age story, POSTER BOY, stars Matt Newton as Henry Kray the cute, closeted, gay 'Poster Boy' son of despised rightwing U.S. Senator Jack Kray, variously known as "the Nazi from North Carolina" and "Mr. Family Values", in the midst of a tight re-election campaign. Framed by Henry's "tell-all" interview with a hard-boiled newspaper reporter, POSTER BOY's loose narrative style brings a gritty and edgy sensibility to this story about coming out at the highest level of public life.


Pink Passes
