Queer Screen is a community, cultural, nonprofit organisation whose main aim is to celebrate and promote Australian and international queer screen culture in all its diversity and richness.

To achieve this aim. Queer Screen produces an annual program highlighted by three main events.

- Mardi Gras Film Festival the biggest event on Queer Screen's calendar.
- My Oueer Career the Australian and New Zealand queer shorts competition held during the Mardi Gras Film Festival, which then tours nationally and internationally.
- □ queerDOC the international documentary film festival presented in September.





Meng Kerou, a seemingly average Taiwanese high school student, has been carrying a secret for too many vears. When her best-friend Lin Yuezhen becomes obsessed with a boy in the swim team, called Zhang Shihao, she asks Meng Kerou to play intermediary. Lines of communication become crossed when Shihao thinks Kerou is the one with the crush on him and pursues her instead. The problem is, Kerou isn't just friends with Yeuzhen, she is in love with her. Writer-director Yee Chih-Yen's second film, Blue Gate Crossing, is choreographed with effortless grace. Events unfold in generous long takes and characters reveal themselves through myriad layers of emotions. Cinematographer Hsiang Chienn captures all this beautifully within the vivid landscape of urban Taipei.

Bree goes to NY where she finds Toby (Kevin Zegers), but does not reveal her secret to him. Toby is working as a hustler and decides to accompany Bree on her trip back to Los Angeles. Transamerica is funny, touching and incredibly human. Felicity Huffman has been mentioned as a strong contender for an Academy Award for this amazing performance. It is a far cry from her role on Desperate Housewives.

The result is funny, sad, sensational and sexy all at the same time. This is the ultimate voyeur's trip into the exploration of the male psyche behind the meat market.—IMDB

This video autobiography gives new meaning to the term cinéma véritéas Everett unflinchingly films her most intimate moments to bring her own experience of lesbian life to the screen. We ride the rough terrain of exes, friends, and roommates, some of whom manage to fit all of these titles. The personal drama unfolds in scenes that move from San Francisco's lesbian sex club to "responsible non-monogamy" lessons at Ethical Slut seminars. Everett and her friends, now approaching midlife, are part of a seminal generation of young lesbians who immigrated to San Francisco in legions in the 1980s. They redefined sexuality in their own style: creating lesbian pornography, strip clubs and sex toy stores. Some of these figures will be familiar including Jackie Strano and Shar Rednour, who pioneered the lesbian porn video business (How to Fuck in High Heels MGFF 2001) and Phyllis Christopher, a leading photographer of lesbian erotica.

The forgotten incident took place in 1966. three years before Stonewall. It began when a policeman entered Compton's Cafeteria, a Tranny hangout, and took a transgender prostitute by the arm. She responded by throwing her coffee in his face. The fuse of mounting tensions was lit, and a riot began. By the time it was over, a police car had been burned. " - San Francisco LGBT Film Festival

Historian Susan Stryker, a guest of the festival, will discuss her discovery of this event and the complex development of the LGBT rights movement with a Q&A after the film. 
