This brave and somewhat confronting film chronicles the moment adolescence ends and adulthood begins for three Czech girls. They've just graduated and Vendula, Karolina and Iska are determined to make their final summer together last. They secretly sign up for jobs on a farm in Holland and start a hitch-hiking journey across Europe. Along the way their behaviour becomes increasingly dangerous as they plot to outdo each other in grown-up escapades, putting themselves, their psyches and their friendship at risk. Unrequited love, sexual manipulation, and spiteful trickery are the key players in this emotional game of chicken, delivered with an intense gravity by the superb young actors.

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
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#### THE RUBRLE
