












From the Festival Director

Before he was every teen's favourite blood sucker, Robert Pattinson played a troubled young Salvador Dali, in this picturesque biopic on the love affair between the great painter and Garcia Lorca. The two men try to fight their affections as their social group (consisting of luminary Spanish contemporaries such as Luis Buñuel) become suspicious and the civil war escalates, and followers of Spanish/queer history will know the inevitable end. Beautifully put together, this is an unexpected, possibly poetic-licensed, spin on two great artists and what, in a different world, might have been.

Germany's seminal split-narrative film, Run Lola Run, gets a San Franciscan reworking in what is already the most popular lesbian film of the year. Commitment-phobic Lola, has one chance to salvage her job and her relationship, but time is running out and a wrong turn or detour will cost her everything. Navigating an obstacle course by sprinting, hitching, flirting and fooling, she must do, and re-do, whatever it takes to keep her girlfriend from the arms of her hot and headstrong ex.

(Jason Bushman, USA/France, 2009, 95 min)

Melancholic man-candy, Jerome, needs to escape Paris and the reminders of his boyfriend in the arms of another guy. Where to go to escape reality...? Los Angeles, of course. In true fish-out-of-water style, Jerome is soon living in a house of We-Ho oddballs, dating a drug dealer, taking acting lessons and auditioning for pizza commercials. But will this sensitive, lovelorn (hung as all hell...) Frenchman survive the Hollywood machine? A feel-good film with a feel-fantastic soundtrack, kooky and compelling characters and a delightfully un-Hollywood sense of self.

This stunningly captured work of magic realism is an impressive follow-up to the gritty intimacy of Puenzo's celebrated debut, XXY.

(Gwen Wynne, 2009, USA, 93 min)

It's the '70s and the world is changing, but maybe not fast enough. Harry Goodhart (Tate Donovan of The OC) has brought his teenage daughters to picturesque Cape Cod for a new start. Joining them is Theo Gibbs (Adam Pascal of Rent), Harry's 'business partner' in an old world furniture-crafting company. The women of Cape Cod couldn't be more excited with the arrival of these hunky bachelors, and when Harry's mischievous daughters spot Daddy and Mr Gibbs at the local gay bar, they decide to assist the local ladies in some heterosexual matchmaking. A warm and wonderful study on the changing of tides.

In the exquisite hills of Basque country, a small farming community struggles to maintain its traditional subsistence existence. The arrival of Jose, a young, handsome immigrant worker from Peru, turns this idyll upside down, as friendship develops into something much deeper and Ander is awakened to the joys and uncertainties of the world outside.

Enter Joan, a nurse with a dark past who is compelled to accept this unusual post, and soon becomes entwined in a passionate, secret affair with her not-so-innocent patient.

(Nicolo Donato, Denmark, 2010, 90 min, subtitled)


This powerful, celebrated Danish drama is a must-see for serious cinephiles this season. Disillusioned and lost, Lars leaves the army in search of something more. He finds Jimmy is magnetised to him and becomes helplessly drawn into the neo-Nazi movement. Despite the risks and repercussions, the two men begin a dangerous secret love affair in a violent social movement that punishes the mere thought of homosexuality.

College Boys Live (George O Donnell, USA, 2009, 90 min)

College Boys Live is a website where you pay to watch young men bonk and beat off in front of web cams at routinely timed hours of the day. House mothers Zac and Jonathan take in a new batch of teens and twenty-somethings every six months. The guys get free board and lodgings in exchange for working the cameras; the current residents are: troubled troublemaker JC, seemingly sweet Tim, and fresh-out-of-the-closetand-ready-for-action Chuck. Their lives under this roof play out in scenes reminiscent of the Jerry Springer show, as housework rosters clash with webcam rosters, bed-hopping becomes bitchslapping and affections turn to jealousy, but the real drama begins when the residents of their suburban neighbourhood decide to kick them out...

Based on their award-winning short from 2006, this feature debut of the same name takes the tension of that moment in time and fleshes out the back story and consequences. Best friends Ben and Alexa are both keen on resident outsider Johnny Drake. Not sure which way he swings, they both take drastic measures to make themselves more appealing to him, both with some success. As the love triangle tangles, loyalties are divided and expectations are both raised and dashed. An excellent example of the teen-romanticangst genre blooming with original and unexpected execution, complete with an utterly enjoyable cast and a director to keep an eye on.

Eating Out 3: All You Can Eat

(Glen Gaylord, USA, 2009, 80 min)

The Eating Out movies are more than just a series, they're becoming a franchise! Here is the third instalment in these riotous, raunchy mistaken-identity romps - All You Can Eat. Tiffani, the now infamous, loveable 'slut' from films 1 and 2, attempts to help her geeky but cute friend Casey find true love - or at least a sexy hunk. 

The Man Who Loved Yngve

(Stian Kristiansen, Norway, 2009)

It's 1989 and Norwegian teen Jarle is getting a life; he starts with a kindred spirit best mate, a killer thrash band, a cool and cute girlfriend, and a totally rad haircut. But it all comes crashing down with the sudden appearance of the new boy in school, Yngve, a tall blond tennis player who teaches Jarle to love synthpop and communal showers. Exploding with youthful enthusiasm, excellent performances and boasting a pitch-perfect turn-of-the-'90s soundtrack, The Man Who Loved Yngve thrillingly conveys the crazy head-rush that is adolescent love in classic Scandinavian understated candour.
