Our opening night film is a tour de force 18th-century lesbian romance that celebrates the female gaze like few before it.

Marianne (Noémie Merlant), a young painter, has been commissioned to do the wedding portrait of Héloïse (French star Adèle Haenel), a reluctant soon-to-be bride who refuses to sit for her portrait – and must be studied in secret. As they stroll along the cliff tops of Brittany an intimacy and attraction swiftly develops between the two women that can not be denied, even as circumstances conspire to keep them apart.

But all is not easy, especially when he's surrounded by a somewhat clueless publicist, and a writing partner who just may be on the edge of a breakdown.

British actor, comedian and TV host Simon Amstell (*Never Mind the Buzzcocks*) writes and directs, and you just know he's observed a few things navigating the London cool-kid circuit. This, his second feature, balances plenty of self-deprecating English wit with surprising moments of humanity and tenderness. *Benjamin* is a cinematic balm for these cynical times.


