

Wildhood




AUSTRALIAN PREMIERE

Directed by Bretten Hannam | Canada | English, and Mi'kmaw with English subtitles | 100 mins | 15+

Set against the wild Nova Scotia landscape, *Wildhood* is the beautiful and captivating odyssey of a closeted First Nations youth in search of belonging. Under the watchful eye of his abusive white father, impulsive two-spirit Mi'kmaw teen Link spends his time taking care of younger half-brother, Travis. But when Link discovers his supposedly-dead mother may be alive, the pair set out to find her. Along the way they connect with pow wow dancer and drifter Pasmay. As Link reclaims his heritage and connection to the land, he and Pasmay find themselves irresistibly drawn to one another. *Content warning: see website*. Mitchell, a successful journalist, finds himself falling for the smoking hot Raheim, a courier and b-boy. Despite his friends' misgivings, Mitchell is enraptured, but the repercussions of their mutual obsession will affect his work, friendships and family. Directed by Horacio Alcalá | Spain, Mexico | Spanish and Zapotec with English subtitles | 97 min | 15+

In a small town outside 0axaca a group of muxes – the indigenous Zapotec "third gender" – band together to survive and thrive in rural Mexico. Together they create beautiful traditional dresses, drawing the eye of a Spanish fashion house seeking native textiles to appropriate. Facing individual battles with grief, trauma and ignorance, an impending tragedy will send shockwaves through their tight-knit community and beyond. Exploring fashion's dual role as a means of exploring and embracing one's identity, and exploiting people's culture, *Finlandia* is a poignant and vibrant magical realist drama about found family, spirituality and hope. *Content warning: see website*. Native American life on the Wind River reservation is a life on the fringes. *Pure Grit* gently focuses its lens on reservation life through Sharmaine, a rising extreme bareback horse riding star in a world dominated by men. As one of the few lesbians on the reservation, Sharmaine is already something of an outlier and possesses a deep understanding of how she needs to heal, succeed, and foster the culture that keeps her alive. Framed by the stunning wilderness of Wyoming, *Pure Grit* is a groundbreaking, optimistic documentary that highlights the power of self determination and cultural connection. *Content warning: see website*.



Fresh, groundbreaking and charming, this Canadian episodic follows two Indigenous queer women with vastly different backgrounds as they find one another and connect in the big city. Daka (Kaitlyn Yott) had a traditional, straight upbringing, dancing on the rez for her whole life. Meanwhile, in Vancouver, Abe (director Mary Galloway) maintains a life as a struggling musician with few ties to her Indigenous heritage. Through fate and an interfering housemate, the two women meet and hit it off. *Querencia* is a romantic coming-of-age, but most importantly, it's a story that has rarely been seen on screen before. Directed by Chen Hung-i and Muni Wei | Taiwan | Mandarin and Min Nan with English subtitles | 107 mins | 15+ $\,$

This Taiwanese adaptation of Shakespeare is a captivating feast for the eyes. With an all-female cast, beautifully nuanced performances from all and a strong and healthy dose of queer pride, *As We Like It* with keep you thoroughly enraptured from start to finish. Set in a futuristic but recognisable Taipei, we follow Rosalind, seeking her father, the Duke. She disguises herself as her twin brother, Roosevelt, and meets Orlando who starts to fall in love with her as a him. A rare and wildly entertaining treat. Directed by Paul Verhoeven | France, Belgium, Netherlands | French and Latin with English subtitles | 132 mins | R18+

Directed by Paul Verhoeven (Basic Instinct, Showgirls, Elle), Benedetta is true to form, delivering a violent, sexual tale of a 17th century nun with visions of Jesus that propel her to seek pleasures of the flesh and punishment of those who oppose her. Whether Benedetta is a saint in the making or a liar covering her tracks doesn't matter once her actions start having serious consequences for the people around her. This titillating, shocking and fascinating portrait of a woman on the brink of madness, torn between lust, desire and sanctity, must be seen to be believed. Content warning: see website.

The breakout hit from Queer Screen Film Fest 2021 is back, and on the big screen! The only son of Turkish immigrants in Switzerland, Beyto's increasing feelings for his swimming coach Mike become the centre of gossip in the tight knit Turkish community. To combat this, Beyto's parents decide that he must marry a woman of their choosing, leaving him at the centre of a turbulent love triangle. Bliss provides an authentic insight into sex work and the lives of the women within it. At its heart, Bliss is a love story between two sex workers - the experienced Sascha, and the youthful Maria. When Maria begins working at a Berlin brothel, there is an instant chemistry between her and Sascha. However, as the film progresses, the character's vulnerabilities begin to come to the forefront, impacting on their relationship. Filmed in a real-life brothel with actual sex workers and clients, Bliss is an authentic, judgement-free, and complex portrayal of sex work. Content warning: see website.

Two transgender men discover each other by chance at the funeral of the beloved matriarch of the Lavender League Lesbian Bowling Club. In vivid retro colours, this arthouse film mixes magical realism with John Waters surrealism and an (almost) all-trans cast and crew. A journey where grief and desire meet and a road-trip to the desert seals a bond for these two men surrounded by change and expectations. With trans actors playing trans and non-trans roles this film explores what it means to be seen in the world. *Content warning: see website*. Screens with *PURRR* (6 mins) Evocative and firmly entrenched in place and character, this sweeping film from Korea has hints of a modern *Brokeback Mountain*. Jin Woo lives and works on a farm with his young daughter, Seol. They are treated as part of the family by the owner and his daughter. This bond is tested with the arrival of his lover, Hyun Min, a poet from Seoul. They are briefly happy until someone from Jin Woo's past appears and shatters the foundations of everything he has built. With flawed characters, stunning cinematography and two handsome leads, this is a feast for the eyes.

The Divide (La Fracture)



AUSTRALIAN PREMIERE

Directed by Catherine Corsini | France | French with English Subtitles | 98 mins | 15+

Amidst the backdrop of citywide demonstrations in Paris, The Divide plots the darkly comedic evening of two women on the verge of breaking up as they become entangled in a hospital ER with injured demonstrators. The ensuing crushing demand on an overstretched hospital leads to chaotic results. This film from out filmmaker, Catherine Corsini (Summertime, MGFF16 Opening Night) is fresh from winning the Queer Palm Award at Cannes, 2021. The Divide skilfully depicts what unfolds when a workplace becomes a war zone and how the most vulnerable are left to deal with the fallout of administration failures and social pressures. Firebird is an epic and compelling true love story set against the repressive background of a Soviet Air Force base during the Cold War. Tom Prior (Kingsman, 2014) stars as troubled young private, Sergey, whose life is turned upside down when Roman, a handsome, daring fighter pilot, arrives at the base. Sergey and Roman embark on a dangerous and forbidden romance that is soon threatened by an escalating KGB investigation. Hedwig Tam and Sz-Wing Yeung shine in this dreamy and nostalgic Hong Kong-set romance. Ming Lee has spent years pining after the girl she fell in love with during high school. When Sylvia contacts Ming Lee before her wedding to be her maid of honour, the feelings she long thought she had worked through resurface as they reflect on their past friendship and relationship. The First Girl I Loved is a tender and affecting tale of first love, companionship, and heartbreak, and is a beautiful piece of Hong Kong cinema. Presented with Advance Diversity Services

With incredible performances, Great Freedom is a moving, unsentimental portrait of a man going through life as truthfully as he can, yearning for love and freedom in the shadows of incarceration and a changing world. In Star Man, the history of LGBTIQ+ media pioneer the Star Observer, and its controversial founder is delved into like never before: The Space Around You follows queer couple Sarah and Bec pre and postpandemic; Deafying Gravity is the unique story of Katia Schwartz, a deaf and queer professional aerial performer; Past Continuous covers one inspiring couple who manage to stay together against all odds: and Acts For The Invisible, in which a philosophical fashion designer changes his world view after a devastating loss. These Shorts About Family Ties show that family means something different to everyone, especially in the LGBTIQ+ community. In Boom and Bloom, a father and son try to bond on a hike in the Austrian Alps; an interracial lesbian couple use straight talk and a little bit of cannabis to ease tensions in Blunt: a breakdown on the way to the airport in Borekas provides a father and son with an opportunity to reconnect; after moving to Los Angeles, Esi discovers a new community in Sunday's Child; and in Baba, we follow a Libyan teen as he attempts to escape to the pulsing queer world of Manchester.

This selection of short films showcases the breadth of gay (plus more) narratives on screen. From the gorgeous animation *Flora Borealis*, composed of 17,000 hand-drawn frames; an energetic tale of *Habib & The Thief; Firsts* from New Zealand about a closeted Chinese international student; *Headlock* where an introverted high school wrestler searches for acceptance; *On My Way* where three men find themselves taking a direction they didn't expect; and *Operator*, a quirky Irish comedy about a self-obsessed call centre worker dealing with a personal heartbreak. *Content warning: see website.*

Get ready to get hot and heavy with these steamy, sexy guy-on-guy short films. Featuring *Chasin*', about a summer's day hook up; in *Eden*, a restless young man roves in the gay hotspots of an unnamed city at night; *The Night Train*, where 0skar finds a like-minded companion on a train; *Trade*, exploring gay hookup app culture; *Limits*, showcasing two men and a challenging game; *BONHOMME*, featuring an eye-opening dare on a rugby player's night out; *Mountain Lodge*, an intriguing experimental film; and *Stephen & James*: *Best Girlfriends*, a lovely homage to 90s sexual liberation.

Trans and Gender Diverse Shorts

This set of shorts will bring on the wanderlust for excitement and adventure of first love, getting to know you, and the feelings of discovery with someone you thought you knew so well. Selected highlights include *Blue Moon* which follows two women in sundrenched Los Angeles; *Dragged Up*, with a shy nonbinary teenager who uses drag to find the confidence they need to show their family who they truly are; and *All the Colours*, in which creative duo The Samaya Wives capture a snapshot of love and life in the pandemic world.



India, USA, Australia, Spain, Croatia, Portugal, South Korea | 111 mins | 15+

Assembling films that put trans and gender diverse stories front and centre, this package includes the multi awardwinning God's Daughter Dancing from South Korea: Croatian animation All These Sensations in My Belly which follows Matia as she seeks a genuine connection; Almost A Year in which the overlapping routines of three New Yorkers changes unexpectedly as the pandemic takes hold; Haze, that shows what happens when Haze's private recordings of their body end up in front of their mother; and Shedding Skin which finds Alicia connecting with her neighbour and starting to find comfort in her own skin.
