Directed by Georgia Oakley | UK | English | 97 mins | Unclassified 15+

In Thatcher-era England, PE teacher Jean leads a double life. Closeted at work, she spends her nights with out-and-proud butch girlfriend Viv. But when a student spots her at a lesbian bar, Jean's carefully compartmentalised life begins to crumble. Set in the shadow of Section 28, forbidding the promotion of homosexuality in schools, this riveting debut is one of the best lesbian films in years and is more timely than ever as similar anti-LGBTIQ+ legislation is proposed around the world. After the founder of a scrappy summer theatre camp falls into a coma, its eccentric staff and students must band together to save it from closure. When her clueless tech-bro son steps in to run the show, drama instructors Amos (Ben Platt) and Rebecca-Diane (Molly Gordon), and production manager Glenn (Noah Galvin), are convinced the only way to keep the camp afloat is to stage a show-stopping original musical, in this farcical tongue-in-cheek mockumentary. *Theater Camp* will send Queer Screen Film Fest out on a high note.



Directed by Poppy Stockell, Tony Radevski | Australia | English | 81 mins | Unclassified 15+

Two hilarious, homegrown comedy series get their big-screen debut. *Triple Oh!* is a comedy-drama about two ambulance paramedics (Brooke Satchwell and Tahlee Fereday) whose personalities clash when street-smart Tayls introduces by-the-book Cate to her policy of having sex when a patient dies. *Fanny Scat Investigates* is the comedic antics of a middle-aged drag queen (Trevor Ashley) who, together with her "opposites attract" crime solving partner Hassan, takes on local, no-job-too-small mysteries to supplement her income as a showgirl. *Followed by a Q&A with the fillmmakers.*



Directed by Jeffrey Schwarz | USA | English | 115 mins | Unclassified 15+

Acclaimed documentarian Jeffrey Schwarz (I Am Divine, Tab Hunter Confidential) delivers an inspiring look into the vital work Los Angeles locals and LGBTIQ+ activists did in driving public awareness towards the HIV/AIDS epidemic. Through rarely seen interview and archival footage, it also dives into the role Hollywood star power – including Elizabeth Taylor – played in fighting stigma and misinformation, as well as influencing funding for a cure. He's joined by a captivating scattering of fresh faces discovering themselves in beautiful, intertwining stories. Following a wildly diverse group of people across the spectrum of age. body shape, gender identity, sexuality and skill level, they come together to courageously challenge notions of who has the right to play football. Followed by a panel discussion with Pride in Sport and the filmmaker in attendance.

It's Only Life After All follows Grammy award winning acoustic folk-rock band the Indigo Girls behind the scenes of their decades long career in the music industry. Having gifted a generation of queer fans anthems to live by in the '80s and '90s, this trailblazing lesbian duo reveal intimate details of their sexuality, friendship and their activism. A renowned author returns to his hometown after 35 years. At a book signing he meets the son of an old flame, with whom he shared a passionate summer fling when he was 17. Is he being bullied? Mistreated? When accusations fly the truth becomes harder to pin down, as the film unfurls Rashomon-style across multiple perspectives. From acclaimed filmmaker Hirokazu Kore-eda (*Shoplifters*), this deeply human, twisty drama won the Queer Palm and best screenplay at Cannes.
