

In a tiny Parisian council flat, fifty-something single mother Nicole and teenage son Serge's relationship fractures as financial pressures mount before Christmas. While the distance grows between them, her own horizons are broadened in the form of the beguiling Nora. Will time apart repair their strained mother-son bond? *Somewhere in Love* is a touching and charming comedic drama about opening yourself to the world and showing up for the ones you love.



In 1931 Berlin, American cabaret singer Sally Bowles (Liza Minnelli) works at the decadent Kit Kat Klub. When she meets British academic Brian Roberts (Michael York) they become lovers, despite Brian's attraction to men. But the arrival of wealthy playboy Maximilian von Heune complicates matters when both fall for his obvious charms. Winner of eight Oscars, this acclaimed musical tale of love and loss amidst the rise of far-right extremism remains as timely now as ever. Once you've watched *LIZA*: A *Truly Terrific Absolutely True Story* (p.43) you'll be itching to revisit her Academy Award-winning performance on the big screen.

Scarecrow in a Garden of Cucumbers



Peppered with madcap musical numbers and Old Hollywood references (plus cameos from Bette Midler and Lily Tomlin), this fabulously camp romp is ready to claim the cult audience it's long deserved.

Chuck Chuck Baby

Prolific low-budget filmmaker Alice Maio Mackay turns her singular eye to Christmas in this grisly neon slasher, edited by Vera Drew (*The People's Joker*, MGFF24). When true crime podcaster and sleuth Lola visits her hometown for the first time since transitioning, the vengeful ghost of a historic murderer (and urban legend) seemingly rises to kill again. In a town haunted by secrets, Lola must solve the case before her community is slaughtered. Screens with *Chloe and Jame* (7 mins). A widowed caregiver's regimented life is upended when her daughter Green moves home with her girlfriend, Rain. Unwilling to accept their relationship, she puts her energy into fighting her employer's bureaucratic heartlessness. When Green's university colleague is dismissed for being gay, she leads a protest that could derail her career. Caught in the middle, Rain becomes an unexpected bridge between mother and daughter, in this beautifully affecting intergenerational drama. Presented with Allianz and The Bookshop Darlinghurst. Retired Georgian teacher Lia promised her dying sister she would find her runaway trans niece, Tekla. Boisterous neighbour Achi offers to accompany Lia to Türkiye to find Tekla, but their search seems in vain – until they meet trans lawyer Evrim, who introduces them to a whole other side of the city. Demons at Dawn

Intertwined bodies become synchronised souls, when a fiery romance is sparked between go-go dancer Orlando and nursing student Marco. Orlando makes ends meet go-going as he dreams of becoming a professional dancer, while Marco is on track to graduate soon. But in a hostile, ever-changing world they'll need to come together to face their individual demons, in this erotic drama from Julián Hernández (*I Am Happiness on Earth*, MGFF15).

Heart of the Man

Aspiring Aboriginal boxer Chris lives in the shadow of his father Sammy (Butchulla filmmaker David Cook), a one-time champ in the ring. Haunted by his wife's death, Sammy pushes Chris to pursue the boxing career he failed to achieve. But when Chris finally accepts his attraction to the handsome Jamie, and spends more time with theatre gays than at the gym, he realises he may be destined to walk another path entirely.*Content warning: see website.* This film was a Queer Screen Goes to Cannes selection. High Tide

Lauded playwright Marco Calvani's debut feature is a sexy, poetic look at the cost of starting anew. Lourenço (Marco Pigossi) is an undocumented Brazilian immigrant, jilted by his boyfriend and having unsatisfying hook-ups in Provincetown. But when he meets nurse Maurice (James Bland), he is swept up in the heat of their attraction and connection. This delicate story also features Oscar-winner Marisa Tomei and Mya Taylor (Tangerine).

I'm Not a Nobody



Love in the Big City

In 1920s England, novelist Owen (Fionn O'Shea; Handsome Devil, MGFF17) is institutionalised for being gay. He forms an unlikely friendship with his psychiatric nurse as he recounts a passionate affair with a doctor named Phillip (Robert Aramayo, *The Rings of Power*). However, their forbidden romance spiralled out of control when Phillip became convinced he could "cure" their homosexuality. A lyrical and deeply defiant period romance inspired by true events. *Content warning: see website.* Heung-soo is a young gay man who is certain that he will never be able to be open about his sexuality.
